

## CURRICULUM VITÆ

**Mondher Kilani** is Professor Emeritus of Cultural and Social Anthropology at the University of Lausanne, Switzerland.

He was Dean of the Faculty of Social Sciences from 1998 to 2000 and Director of the Laboratory of Cultural and Social Anthropology (LACS) in the same university from 2000 to 2013.

He was a research associate and a visiting professor in several universities, notably in United States (Department of Anthropology, University of California at Berkeley), France (École Pratique des Hautes Études, Paris), Belgium (Department of Social and Political Sciences, University of Louvain-La-Neuve), Italy (Istituto universitario Suor Orsola Benincasa, University of Napoli), Switzerland (Institut d'ethnologie, Faculté des Lettres, University of Neuchâtel), Marocco (École de Gouvernance et d'Économie, Rabat), Tunisia (Centre d'anthropologie, Faculté des lettres et des sciences humaines, University of Sousse).

He conducted research in Papua New Guinea on “Cargo cults and religious transformation”; in the Swiss Alps on “Agriculture, tourism and modernity”; in the Oases of South Tunisia on “Lineage, sainthood and water distribution”; in Niger in West Africa on “Hausa agriculture” and “Peul pastoralism”; in Malaysia on “Heritage and cultural diversity management ”; and in Singapore on “Museum strategies in a City-World”.

His current theoretical and thematic interests include violence and war; religion and secularism; heritage, ethnicity and multiculturalism; sacrifice and cannibalism; history and epistemology of anthropology.

He is member of the scientific committee of several journals : *Anthropologie et Sociétés*, Québec, Canada ; *Archivio Antropologico Mediterraneo*, Palermo, Italie ; *Cargo, Cahiers du Canthel*, Paris, France ; *Journal des Anthropologues*, Paris, France ; *L'ethnographie*, Paris, France ; *Parcours Anthropologiques*, Lyon, France.

He is also the coredactor of the online international dictionary of anthropology *Anthropen* (<https://www.anthropen.org>)
