

## Elyès Jouini

### Short curriculum

Elyès Jouini is professor of mathematics and economics at University Paris Dauphine-PSL and is the holder of the Dauphine Foundation Chair “Women and Science”. He served as Vice-president of the university and as President of the Dauphine Foundation. He graduated from the Ecole normale supérieure (Paris, rue d’Ulm) and ranked first at the *agrégation de mathématiques*. He holds a PhD and an *Habilitation à diriger des recherches* from Université Paris 1 Panthéon-Sorbonne. He served previously as professor at this university as well as at ENSAE (National School of Statistics and Economics), at the Stern School of Business (New-York University) and at the Université de Tunis. Most of his research is at the interplay between mathematics, economics and finance. Elyès is honorary member of the Institut universitaire de France, fellow of the Econometric Society, of the Institute for Labor Studies (IZA) and of the Institut Louis Bachelier. He served as member of the Scientific Committee of the Banque de France Foundation and he is Board member of the Banque de Tunisie as well as other private companies.

Elyès Jouini has served as member of the Experts High Level Group (attached to the European Commissioner for Research Innovation and Science), as member of the Economic Analysis Council (attached to the French Prime Minister), of the Economic Analysis Council (attached to the Tunisian Head of Government) and of the High-Council for Science and Technology (attached to the French President). Elyès is co-founder and life-member of the Bachelier Finance Society. He also founded and has been the first Editor in Chief of Mathematics and Financial Economics. He has published widely, about 80 articles, in top Economics, Mathematics and Finance academic journals. He also edited and co-edited several books. Elyès Jouini has shortly served in 2011 as Member of the Tunisian Transition Government (Economic and Social Reforms and coordination between the concerned ministers). He is the founder and first President of the *Association des Tunisiens des Grandes Ecoles* (ATUGE). He received the Best Young French Economist Prize. He is Chevalier de la Légion d’Honneur (France) and Commandeur de l’Ordre du Mérite (Tunisia).
